Public Notary Services:

The city clerk is a Notary Public. The City will be offering this service during business hours. You may contact the City if you have additional questions.

Planning & Zoning Regulations:

The City has both building codes and zoning codes, so if you are starting a project such as a shed, deck, addition or new build please check with the City to see what permits you will need and if it meets zoning setbacks. A simple phone call or email to discuss your project will save you time and frustration as you plan for your project. We are seeing an increase in activity in the area and permits are taking longer to process so please plan your projects accordingly.

Vacation Rentals:

The City has regulations concerning Vacation/Short-Term Rentals that were adopted with the Zoning & Subdivision Ordinance #285. If you operate a Vacation/Short-Term Rental, you are now required to register with the City. The registration fee for the first year is \$50 and subsequent years are \$25. Vacation/Short-Term Rental registration forms are available to download on the City's website.

Water and Streets:

It's getting to be that time of year to start thinking about winterizing your outdoor faucets and sprinkler systems. Don't forget your vehicles too, make sure you check your radiator and window washer fluids for the appropriate levels. It's also a good time of year to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and clean your chimney. Daylight Savings time ends November 7th, remember to set your clocks back 1 hour the night of the 6th.

Burn Permits:

Burn permits will no longer be required after October 20th. Please follow Idaho Department of Lands for the Air Quality and check with Sam Owen Fire for any burn restrictions in place.

Annual Tree Lighting Celebration:

This years annual tree lighting celebration will be held Friday, December 3rd at 5:30 pm. The City plans to add additional lights and displays for an even bigger celebration. Snacks and refreshments will be served at city hall immediately following the lighting ceremony.

Park Update:

The playground equipment has arrived and the center of the park is beginning to take shape. The City should be ready to plant the plants and install the playground equipment come spring. Just a reminder we are still taking donations for the park, and veteran tiles or brick pavers are still available as well.

PECAN PIE BARS

Taste of Home

INGREDIENTS:

- 2 CUPS ALL PURPOSE FLOUR
- 1 CUP BUTTER, SOFTENED
- 1 LARGE EGG, ROOM TEMPERATURE

PINCH SALT

1 CUP CHOPPED PECANS

- 1/2 CUP CONFECTIONERS' SUGAR
- 1 CAN (14 OUNCES) SWEETEN CONDENSED MILK
- 1 TEASPOON VANILLA EXTRACT
- 1 PACKAGE (80UNCE) MILK CHOCOLATE ENGLISH TOFFEE BITS

DIRECTIONS:

In a large bowl, combine flour and sugar. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse meal. Press firmly onto the bottom of a greased 13x9 baking dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, beat the milk, egg, vanilla and salt until smooth. Stir in toffee bits and pecans; spread evenly over baked crust. Bake until lightly browned, 20-25 minutes longer. Cool. Cover and chill; cut into bars. Store in refrigerator.
