East Hope City Park:



Grants, grants, grants, donations, donations, donations. The City is actively applying for grants and seeking donations to help finish the park. We are also considering different fundraising ideas so if you think you might have a great idea for a fundraiser please share it with us. We are always interested in new ideas for raising park funds.

We have set our goals high this year for what we want to get completed in the park. The focus this spring and summer will be to get the playground equipment installed, the irrigation completed, get the pavers installed, get some plants in and get some sod installed.

Public Notary Services:

The city clerk is a Notary Public. The City will be offering this service during business hours. You may contact the City if you have additional questions.

Planning & Zoning Regulations:

The City has both building codes and zoning codes, so if you are starting a project such as a shed, deck, addition or new build please check with the City to see what permits you will need and if it meets zoning setbacks. A simple phone call or email to discuss your project will save you time and frustration as you plan for your project. We are seeing an increase in activity in the area and permits are taking longer to process so please plan your projects accordingly.

Vacation Rentals:

The City has regulations concerning Vacation/Short-Term Rentals that were adopted with the Zoning & Subdivision Ordinance #285. If you operate a Vacation/Short-Term Rental, you are now required to register with the City. The registration fee for the first year is \$50 and subsequent years are \$25. Vacation/Short-Term Rental registration forms are available to download on the City's website.

Streets:

It is still snow plowing season but we are keeping an eye out for the spring thaw and drainage issues. If you happen to notice drainage issues around town please report them to city hall.

As for the snow please remember the streets are narrow, please do not park in public right-of-way areas, this makes plowing extremely difficult. The City will not be held responsible for damage done to vehicles that are located within the right-of-ways. The City is asking that you do not shovel or plow snow into the City's streets. This causes a safety hazard for other motorists and the City's snow removal equipment.

The first priority during a snow event is to plow all the roads. Sanding generally begins after plowing a road is completed. Sand is applied to steeper roadway grades, at intersections and other areas determined to be hazardous. A salt brine solution is also utilized when conditions are appropriate. Safe travels.

BLACK FOREST BROWNIE BARS

INGREDIENTS

1 box fudge brownie mix
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1 1/4 cup chocolate chips

2 large eggs
1 can cherry pie filling divided
red candy melts, optional

INSTRUCTIONS

Mix the brownie mix, eggs, oil and 1 cup of cherry pie filling together. Spread into an 8x8 inch baking pan that has been lined with parchment paper. Drop the remaining pie filling over the top of the batter and marble with the blade of a knife. Bake in a preheated 350 F degree oven for 45 to 60 minutes or until the center is set. Remove from oven and sprinkle chocolate chips over the hot brownies. Allow them to melt 10 minutes. Spread melted chocolate over the top with a spatula. Allow chocolate to set before cutting. Drizzle with more melted chocolate and melted red candy melts to decorate. (optional) Makes 9 servings.
