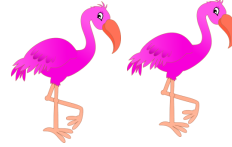

**Public Notary Services:** The city clerk is a Notary Public. The City will be offering this service during business hours. You may contact the City if you have additional questions.

**Planning & Zoning Regulations:** The City has both building codes and zoning codes, so if you are starting a project such as a shed, deck, addition or new build please check with the City to see what permits you will need and if it meets zoning setbacks. A simple phone call or email to discuss your project will save you time and frustration as you plan for your project. We are seeing an increase in activity in the area and permits are taking longer to process so please plan your projects accordingly.

**Drop Box at City Hall:** The drop box at city hall is for water payments only. Please do not put your sewer payment in this box, the City does not handle the sewer system. Ellisport Bay Sewer District is responsible for the sewer system and collection of payments.

**Spring Clean-up:** As the weather begins to warm up and spring clean-up begins please be aware that burn permits aren't required until May 10th. It is always a good idea whether burn permits are required or not to check air quality and burn conditions at:

**Please Be Mindful.....** As outdoor spring clean-up gets underway do not rake debris into ditches along the roadway. This creates a hazard for stormwater run-off and you will be responsible for removing it.

**Streets:** Load limit signs are up so please plan accordingly. A red flag or no flag means load limits are in place, green flag means no restriction. If you are unsure please contact city hall. As the weather begins to warm and spring run-off starts, if you see drainage issues please notify city hall.

**Street Projects:** The City was awarded a \$100,000 grant from LHTAC (Local Highway Technical Council) to chip seal roads within East Hope. This project went out for bid in March and will be awarded at the April Council Meeting. Chip sealing will occur this summer and the roads slated to be chip sealed are Lakeview Blvd, Ellisport Street, Lookout Blvd, Cedar Street, Hope Ave, and the lower portion of School Road. More information will be posted as a schedule is determined.

The City was also just awarded a \$30,000 grant for sign replacement to bring street sign into compliance with the MUTCD code (Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices). This work will occur next year (2023).

**Water:** As the weather warms up and you turn your sprinkler systems back on, please monitor for possible leaks after the long cold winter. If you have backflow devices now is the time to have them tested. The City has a cross connection control ordinance (#227) that requires all backflow devices to be tested yearly and a copy of those results sent to the City.

**CARROT CAKE BARS**

**CARROT CAKE BAR INGREDIENTS:**

- |                         |                         |
|-------------------------|-------------------------|
| 1/2 CUP BUTTER          | 1 CUP LIGHT BROWN SUGAR |
| 1 LARGE EGG             | 1 TBS VANILLA           |
| 1 CUP ALL PURPOSE FLOUR | 1 TSP CINNAMON          |
| 1/4 TSP BAKING POWDER   | 1/4 TSP SALT            |
| 1 CUP SHREDDED CARROTS  |                         |

**CHEESECAKE SWIRL INGREDIENTS**

- 4 OUNCES CREAM CHEESE @ ROOM TEMPERATURE
- 1/4 CUP SUGAR
- 1 LARGE EGG YOLK
- 3/4 TSP VANILLA

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray 8x8 baking pan with non-stick spray and set aside. Place butter in microwave-safe bowl for 30 seconds. Melt butter completely. In a medium bowl, add the melted butter and brown sugar. Mix to combine. Stir in the egg and vanilla. Add in the flour, cinnamon, baking powder, and salt. Stir until completely combined. Fold in the carrots. Set aside. In a medium bowl, add in the cream cheese and sugar. Beat with a mixer until smooth. Add in the egg yolk and vanilla. Beat until smooth and creamy. Add about half of the carrot cake batter into the pan and spread it out. Add half of the cheesecake batter to the carrot cake batter. Do this by dropping dollops of batter over the carrot cake. Don’t swirl yet. Add remaining carrot cake batter on top. Add the remaining cheesecake batter by dollops. Using a knife or skewer, swirl the batters together. Swirl as much or as little as you like. Bake for about 35-40 minutes until edges are golden brown. There will be a little jiggle to the center. Cool completely before cutting. Store leftovers in the refrigerator.
